

# Impromptu Speaking: The Climate Challenge

## The Rules:

- **Prep Time:** 2 Minutes | **Speech Length:** 3 Minutes
- **The Formula:** AGD - Road Map - Evidence/Examples - Relevance Tie-back - Closing

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## Part 1: The Prompts (Choose One)

1. "The greatest threat to our planet is the belief that someone else will save it." – *Robert Swan*
2. "Climate is what we expect, weather is what we get." – *Mark Twain* (Can be applied to people's personalities!)
3. **The Social Climate:** How the "atmosphere" of a room or a country changes based on the people in it.
4. **Adapt or Perish:** Why the ability to change with our environment is the most important human trait.
5. **The Butterfly Effect:** How small changes in one part of a "climate" lead to massive effects elsewhere.

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### Strategic Examples

- **Scientific Example (The Greenhouse Effect):** Discuss how small, invisible gases create massive changes. Use this to prove that **small actions matter**.
- **Historical Example (The Dust Bowl):** During the 1930s, the climate changed due to poor farming and drought. Use this to prove **the consequences of ignoring warning signs**.
- **Metaphorical Example (The "Climate" of a Locker Room):** In sports, a "toxic climate" can make a talented team lose, while a "positive climate" can make an average team win. Use this for the **Social Climate** prompt.
- **Business Example (Kodak or Nokia):** These companies failed to adapt to the "digital climate" of the 21st century. Use this for the **Adapt or Perish** prompt.
